BAPTISMS

The sacrament of Baptism is celebrated either during a weekend Mass or on the third Sunday of the month at 12:30 pm (immediately following 11:15 am Mass). Parents must attend a Baptism Preparation class prior to the Baptism. Classes are held in the Parish Center at 7:00 pm on the first Thursday of each month. Please call the Parish Center for more information.

Required paperwork **MUST** be submitted to the parish office **no later than ten (10) business days prior to the baptismal date or your date will be rescheduled.** This includes all necessary information regarding family records and godparents. Please read the **baptism planning information** provided before selecting a godparent. A sponsor certificate must be provided **by each godparent.** The proper **sponsor certificate** for St. Peter the Apostle is included with the baptism packet. Christian witnesses are most welcome to celebrate with the family and community, but please note they are not recorded as sponsors on the Baptismal Certificate or in the Baptismal Register.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

If you or someone you know is in need of this Sacrament, please contact the Parish Center at any time. Upon admission to the hospital, please make it known you are a member of St. Peter the Apostle Catholic Church.

WEDDINGS

According to diocesan policy, the parish must be contacted six months prior to the intended wedding date. Please call the Parish Center (ext. 201) for information.

IF YOU ARE HOSPITALIZED...

If you or a family member are admitted to the hospital, please contact the Parish Center to let us know. Due to federal regulations, most hospitals will not contact parishes unless you specifically request it. We want to visit parishioners in the hospital, but are often unaware of their hospitalization.

Shut-ins



If it is too difficult for you to walk to the front of the church to receive Communion, please know that at each Mass an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion comes to the back of the church to distribute Communion. If you would like to have the Extraordinary Minister give you communion in the back of church, please let an usher know before Mass begins. At Communion time, when you see the Extraordinary Minister come to the back, please raise your hand so that they can see you and give you Holy Communion.

This Wednesday we celebrate the Assumption of Blessed Mary into heaven, which means she was taken up into heavenly glory, body and soul, at the end of her life. As the Assumption is a Holy Day of Obligation, Holy Mass will be offered at 8:00 am, 12:00 noon, and 7:00 pm. The Assumption was proclaimed a dogma of faith (a truth appertaining to faith or connected to it which must be believed by the Catholic faithful) on November 1, 1950 by Pope Pius XII. The dogma contains the wording, "having completed the course of her earthly life," which includes the possibilities of her dying before or after her assumption into heaven. The most common teaching of the early Fathers is she died prior to her assumption.

From the Pastor



Blessed Mary's Assumption shows us, as Jesus said to the Apostles at the Last Supper, that He is preparing a place in heaven for us to be with Him. As our focus should always be on obtaining heaven, this should bring us great joy and consolation especially when life gets difficult. Blessed Mary is an incomparable example of humility before God in good times and bad. She not only offered God her joys but her great sorrows, as well. She always saw the divine will in every moment and situation of her life and humbly submitted them to the glory of God. She didn't hesitate when Joseph told her they must flee into Egypt, nor did she question the will of the Father. She accepted and trusted in God's love. She did all things with an overwhelming love and charity, which led her to the foot of the cross of her Son and Savior, Jesus Christ. She is the daughter, spouse and mother of God. She is our mother too and gives our prayers to Jesus—all polished and wrapped in just the right way.

Let us honor Blessed Mary in a special way, on this her feast day, remembering she is always with us "now and at the hour of our death." Amen.

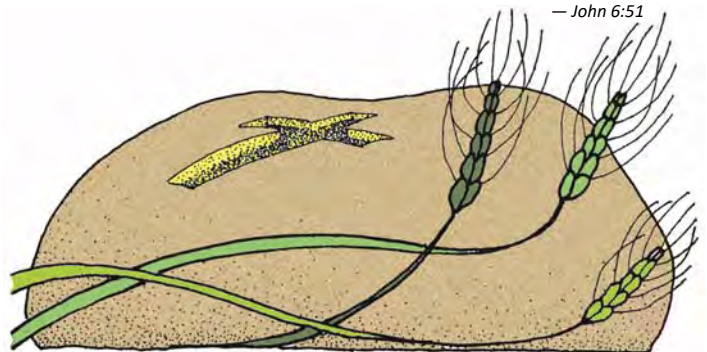

We meet in the Parish Center on the second Sunday of the month following the 9:30 am Mass (approximately 10:30am).

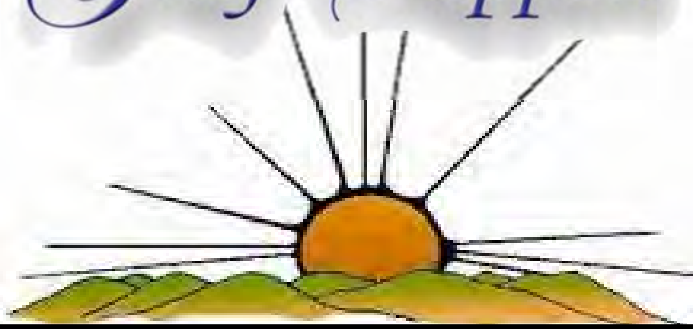

Even though the site states “Monday - Friday, 9:00 am - 5:00 pm” for emergency consultation questions, calls are returned even after hours.



Supreme Court Justice Anthony Kennedy's announcement that he will retire has catapulted *Roe v. Wade* (the Supreme Court's landmark abortion case) into the news. Pro-abortion groups are pulling out all the stops to urge the U.S. Senate to reject any nominee who does not promise to publicly endorse *Roe*. And they are misrepresenting the legal and social reality of *Roe* and what would happen if it is overturned.

The upcoming Supreme Court vacancy provides us with yet another occasion requiring focused prayer. The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops does not support or oppose the confirmation of any presidential nominee. However, given this historic moment, the U.S. bishops are urging all people of good will to pray that a change in the U.S. Supreme Court may move our nation closer to the day when every human being is protected in law and welcomed in life.

From **Friday, August 3, 2018 to Friday, September 28, 2018**, the weekly Call to Prayer and Fasting will be adapted as a nine-week Novena for the Legal Protection of Human Life. In addition to the invitation to fast on Fridays, everyone is encouraged to pray daily one *Our Father*, *Hail Mary*, and *Glory Be* for the intention of the novena.
