HELPING HANDS CLOTHING COLLECTION

Beginning at the end of March, there will be a clothing collection bin installed on our parish property. It will be located at the north end of the west side of our parking lot. Operated by **Helping Hands**, the bin is for **clothing and textile** recycling. Wearable clothing will be cleaned, sorted and given a new life for those in need. Worn-out clothing and other fabrics/textiles will be separated out, bundled and sold to manufacturers who use textile fibers in making other products and materials.

Helping Hands will pay our parish based on the volume of materials collected. All money received will be doated to the Itasca Walk-In ministries to support their efforts in caring for those in need.

Please only donate clean materials. This can include clothes, sheets, blankets, towels, unwanted fabric, quilts, bedspreads and any other fabric materials. Clean shoes are also accepted, regardless of condition. Your contributions support corporal works of mercy; specifically clothing the naked, feeding the hungry and giving drink to the thirsty.

So, in the future, don't throw away fabrics. Clean them and turn them in. You will be helping others in a wide number of ways.
